



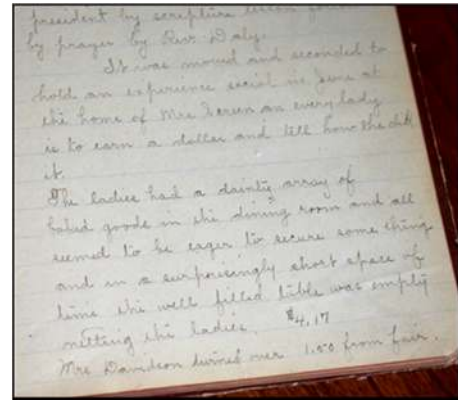

We've been doing some decluttering/organizing around the church. In the process, I came across a whole stack of old Ladies Aid Society journals, with minutes from their meetings going back over 100 years. It's offered a fascinating glimpse into the history of the congregations that helped form United Faith. The above quote is one that caught my imagination, as well as one where they debated scaling back the fancy lunches they served at meetings because of the "high cost of living" - in 1917!

It has reminded me how much I appreciate the tradition of faith represented by this church - the many generations who sought to live faithfully in mission and discipleship, and the rich legacy they created for us. The history we share give a solid foundation to our life together. As we celebrate Pentecost this month and the movement of the Holy Spirit, I also appreciate today's congregation's vision and hope for the future. We are enriched by our history, but not defined or constrained by it!

One of my favorite Pentecost hymns says *"You call from tomorrow, you break ancient schemes, from the bondage of sorrow the captives dream dreams, our women see visions, our men clear their eyes, with bold new decisions your people arise."* God is calling, with a vision and purpose for us here. Your Session and PNC are working hard at discerning how to most faithfully answer that call. I hope you are continuing to keep them supported by your prayers so we may boldly go where God leads!

Our history is a great inheritance that has been passed down - not for us to hold on to for ourselves, but for us to pass on to those who come after us, those hungering and thirsting to know the grace of God. The best way to witness and honor the faithfulness of our preceding generations is in finding new ways to tell the "old, old story" to a new audience. On Sunday, June 4 we will dedicate our gift to the Pentecost Offering during worship. Since the Pentecost Offering started in 1998, Presbyterians have raised more than \$11 million dollars for ministries that benefit the younger members of God's family. With the Pentecost Offering, 40% of the monies received remain at United Faith. Twenty five percent of the offering goes to the Young Adult Volunteer program to train and equip young adults to work at more that twenty one mission sites in the United States and around the world. Another twenty-five percent of the offering supports ministries with youth ages 12 -18 and the final ten percent of the offering supports the "Educate a Child, Transform the World" national initiative started by General Assembly in 2014 to motivate and inspire Presbyterians to better the lives of one million children by 2020. An offering envelope is included in your 2017 offering envelope box. Thank you for your support of the Pentecost Offering.

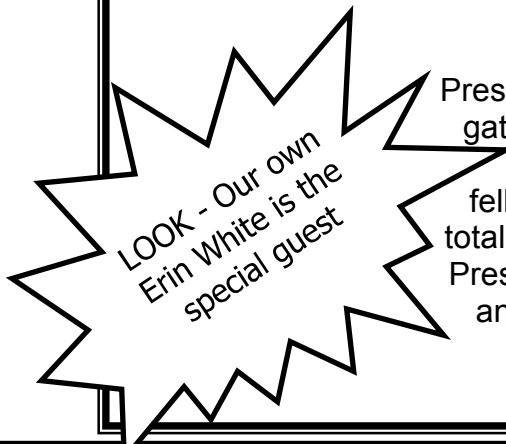
